Established in 1870, the Ohio State University is one of the nation's leading comprehensive teaching and research universities. Offering an extensive range of academic programs spanning the liberal arts, the sciences, and the professions, Ohio State supports 19 colleges and seven schools with more than 170 undergraduate majors, 200 graduate fields of study, and 10,500 courses.

More than 49,500 students come to the Columbus campus representing every state and more than 100 foreign countries, making it the second largest campus in the United States.

Academic Reputation

Ohio State is consistently ranked among the nation's top 25 public institutions and rates the highest among Ohio institutions for academic reputation, according to U.S. News & World Report's annual survey of "America's Best Colleges."

Research

Much of the basic and applied research in the United States is done in some 50 national universities, one of the most comprehensive being Ohio State. Ohio State's total research funding has nearly doubled over the last five years.

Ohio State faculty are involved in scholarship and service in more than 100 countries and have received national and international recognition for their research. The university is home to a Nobel Laureate, Sloan Foundation fellows, National Science Foundation Presidential/National Young Investigators, as well as acclaimed artists, musicians, and writers.
